Information for Patients

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Introduction

The Clinical Immunology Service for adults and children is based at the Leicester Royal Infirmary (LRI). We provide a service to patients from Leicester, Leicestershire, Rutland and Northamptonshire.

We investigate, diagnose and manage patients with a likely history of immune deficiency.

Outpatient clinics for adults and children

The adult outpatient clinic is based at the LRI on a Monday afternoon and Thursday morning. We use a mix of video, telephone, and face to face for appointments.

Day case admissions for treatment takes place on Ward 19 at Leicester General Hospital. These are for having immunoglobulin therapy through your vein (intravenous infusions), and for training in giving yourself your medications.

The children's outpatient clinic is held in the Children's Outpatient Department at LRI on Wednesday morning. We use a mix of video, telephone and face to face for appointments.

Day case admissions for children's treatment takes place on the Children's Day Case Unit, Ward 28 at LRI. Here we give medication through your vein (intravenous administration), teach you how to give your own immunoglobulin and carry out blood test monitoring and booster immunisations.

A transition clinic for patients moving from the children's service to the adult service takes place every 3 months in the Children's Outpatient Department at LRI.

All hospital sites have wheelchair access.

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Our service carries out the following as part of Leicester's Hospitals:

- **Research** our department is involved in local and national research projects with the aim of increasing knowledge around immunodeficiency disorders.
- Education and training our service is involved in the delivery of educational sessions for various medical and nursing professionals. We are members of the United Kingdom Primary Immunodeficiency Network (UK PIN) and the Immunology and Allergy Nurses Network.
- We present at national and international conferences.
- We hold regular primary immunodeficiency disorder meetings, as part of a multi-disciplinary team (MDT).

Links with other services

We are a recognised accredited 'Quality in Primary Immunodeficiency (QPIDS)" centre.

Patients who have medical conditions which need review by other specialties or support services are referred to the relevant specialist. Special arrangements are in place with the community dental services at Westcotes Dental Clinic for patients with hereditary angioedema (HAE).

We are part of the Trent Regional Immunology and Allergy Consortium (TRIAC) which holds meetings every 3 months. We have links with immunology colleagues across the country via the Immunology Travellers Group as well as through national and international meetings.
