Useful information

- We will provide you with medication (including any nutritional supplements) and any other supplies you need to last for your first seven days at home. Your GP will then continue any prescriptions as needed.
- Please remember that although you are medically fit to be discharged from hospital it may be some time before you are able to go back to your normal level of activity.
- Gentle exercise is recommended after treatment for cancer if you feel well enough.
- Please ask your nurse if you require a sick note (fit note) for work.
- Changes to your sleeping pattern are normal after major surgery, especially when you go home. Take naps in the day if needed and if the problems continue see your GP for further advice.
- If you have dressings that need to be changed or stitches to be removed you will be referred to your local community nurses.
- If you feel able you can also self-manage any small dressings at home, such as a tracheostomy dressing if you have one. Please ask the ward staff to show you what to do.

What to look out for

Contact your GP, CNS / key worker or the Kinmonth Unit if you notice any of the following:

- Soreness, redness or pus from around your feeding tube (if you have one)
- A high temperature that does not respond to paracetamol or lasts for more than 24 hours.
- Any signs of infection (soreness, redness, pus) around your surgical wounds.
- Vomiting or diarrhoea which lasts for more than 24 hours.
- Any bleeding that does not stop: call 999 immediately.
