### Introduction

This leaflet has been written for patients diagnosed with bone metastases and myeloma bone disease. It may also be useful for family, friends and carers.

### What is metastatic bone disease?

This is when your main (primary) cancer has spread to your bones. The medical term for this is 'bone metastases'. It is also known as 'secondary cancer'.

### What are bone metastases?

Bone metastases are a result of your primary cancer spreading. It happens when cancer cells break away from your primary cancer and travel through the blood or lymph system to other parts of your body, in this case your bones.

### What is myeloma bone disease?

Myeloma is a primary bone marrow cancer rather than a secondary cancer. Myeloma bone disease happens due to activation of cells that break down bone (osteoclasts) caused by myeloma cells. It can affect any bone and can be at multiple sites in the body and can result in the bones becoming weaker.

### The Metastatic Bone Disease Specialist Nurse:

- works closely with orthopaedic surgeons, oncologists, haematologists, cancer specialist nurses and other healthcare professionals both in the hospital and the community.
- provides emotional and psychological support to help you to adjust to living with your diagnosis.
- aims to be present at your consultations where possible.
- acts as a link between the orthopaedic and oncology / haematology teams to ensure that you receive the care that you need in an effective and efficient way.
- offers continuing support and information to patients and families. This may be face-to-face or over the telephone.
