### Your referral

You have been given this leaflet because your consultant/ paediatrician or GP has referred you to the Children's Pain Management Service.

## What does the Children's Pain Management Service do?

Our service will try to find ways to help you/ your child cope with long standing pain.

You will meet a number of different professionals who work together as a team and with you, to explore different ways of managing your pain.

It is important for you to know that we will not be involved in diagnosing the cause of your pain, or carrying out further tests for your pain.

Our service will explore ways to help manage pain. This may include reducing the number of medications you take, alongside different ways to manage the pain.

If you do not think our service is suitable for you, please cancel your appointment as quickly as possible. This will help us to give your appointment to another patient.

If arriving by car please allow plenty of time for parking before your appointment.

#### What will happen at my appointment?

At your appointment you will be seen by all of the pain management team at the same time. In the appointment room there will be a:

- Pain Consultant
- Consultant Paediatrician
- Clinical Psychologist
- Physiotherapist
- Pain Specialist Nurse

The appointment will last for about 1 hour. You will be given the opportunity to discuss your pain and how this affects you and your family. It may also involve a brief examination in a different room.

You will then sit in the waiting area for 5 to10 minutes while the team discuss your plan of care. You will all then come back into the appointment room where we will discuss ways to manage the pain involving parents/ family as needed. This may include medical, non-medical and/ or psychological treatment or interventions.

We know that many of our patients travel from the surrounding Midlands area, as our service here in Leicester is a specialist centre. If your local hospital/ community does not provide some of the specialist management services for treatment or interventions, you may need to travel to Leicester on a regular basis.
