

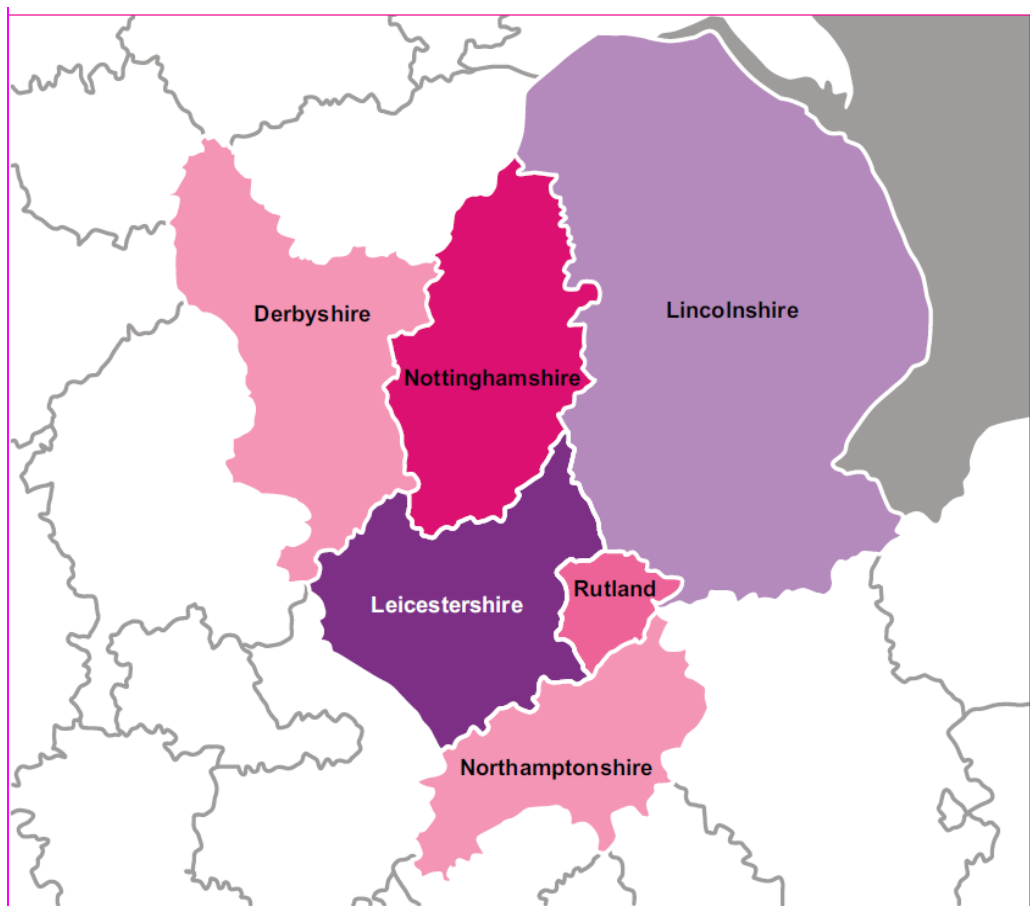

Sarcoma nurse specialist

The sarcoma nurse specialist will be your 'key worker'. The role of the key worker is to provide you with a point of contact and to help co-ordinate your care. Your key worker can offer you support and advice about your care and treatment, even if you are attending a different hospital for your treatment. Your key worker will also be able to put you in touch with other professionals who can offer support and care.

Multidisciplinary team

Once you have had your initial tests and investigations your case will be discussed at the weekly sarcoma multidisciplinary (MDT) meeting. The team of health professionals looking after you is known as the multidisciplinary team, or MDT.

Please be aware that in some circumstances discussions may be delayed to allow for additional information to be obtained or discussions are deferred due to emergencies. A member from your specialist team will notify you of any changes.

Healthcare team members who may be part of your MDT

Key worker - can provide support, advice and information about your cancer. He or she can explain the treatments available to you and can discuss any concerns you may have. Your key worker will act as a link between you and the rest of the team, continuing to support you before, during and after your treatment. Your key worker may be a clinical nurse specialist (CNS) or a physiotherapist.

Support worker - provides support, advice and information. The support worker can act as a link between you and the CNS

Sarcoma surgeon - a surgeon (doctor) who is specially trained in the surgical treatment of sarcomas.

Oncologist - a doctor who specialises in the treatment of cancer.

Radiologist - a doctor who understands and interprets any scans or x-rays you have had.

Histopathologist - uses specialised equipment to examine any tissue removed during biopsy. This enables the team to diagnosis the type and extent of the problem and also helps when planning further treatment that may be required.

MDT co-ordinator - an administrator who ensures the smooth running of the MDT meetings. Other members of your health care team may also be present at the MDT meeting; for example, a dietitian, occupational therapist, physiotherapist or member of the palliative care team might be involved in the meeting.

What happens at MDT meeting?

The MDT meets on Monday lunchtimes (not Bank Holidays) to ensure that each patient is given the same high standard of care, and has the most appropriate investigations and treatment, no matter who their GP is or which hospital they attend. The Sarcoma MDT takes place with video links to teams in Leicester, Nottingham, Northampton, Kettering, Derby and Lincoln.

The MDT is attended by health care professionals only.

During the meeting, your healthcare team will look at your medical notes and any relevant tests, scans etc that you have had. As a team, they will decide on the best treatment plan for you, based on the results of these tests, taking into account the type of cancer you have, your general health and any other relevant issues. Your team may decide that you need to have further tests or be referred to other members of the healthcare team.

How will I find out the outcome of the MDT meeting?

A member of the team will discuss your treatment plan with you. This will usually be at your out-patient appointment, or may be by telephone, if you have agreed to being contacted by telephone.

Your GP will be informed of the MDT discussion by letter.
