If you have had sedative medicine:

For 12 hours you should:

- be accompanied by a responsible adult.

For 24 hours:

- do not drive a car or ride a bicycle.
- do not drink alcohol.
- do not operate any machinery or do anything which needs skill or judgement.
- do not make important decisions or sign any documents.
- do not climb ladders.
- do not return to work until after this period of time.

General advice

- Go home and rest.
- You will be given something to eat and drink before discharge and may continue to eat and drink as normal.
- General abdominal discomfort and swelling is often due to retained colonic air.
- You may feel a little bloated with wind pains but these usually settle quickly. Changing position and going to the toilet to pass wind will help.

- You may have mild diarrhoea for up to a week.
- Small amounts of rectal bleeding are not of concern.
- Small bleeding may occur 7 to 14 days after, due to secondary haemorrhage.

When to seek help

You should contact the Endoscopy Department where your procedure was carried out, if you have any of the following:

- Sudden tummy (abdominal) pain, particularly if it is severe and persistent.
- Heavy bleeding.
- Vomiting blood.
- Passing jet black poo (stool).

If the department is closed, contact your GP for advice. Should neither be available and if you have heavy bleeding and/ or severe pain, go to the Emergency Department or call the NHS helpline on 111 for an ambulance.

You will be given a copy of your endoscopy report in case you need to go to the Emergency Department, which you should take with you.
