Which patients are on Wards 42 and 43?

Gastroenterology and Hepatology are the medical specialities that help patients with medical conditions affecting the food pipe (oesophagus), stomach, intestines, and the liver.

Wards 42 and 43 are in the modular building at the Leicester Royal Infirmary.

Please do not hesitate to let us know which areas of care we offer well and which areas we may need to improve on.

Our patients are usually admitted from the Emergency Department, GPs, other wards within the urgent care centres, other hospitals within the East Midlands, or from their own home.

The consultant/ medical teams

Our wards have 3 teams of consultants who look after different areas of digestive diseases:

- **The luminal team** look after mainly with patients with conditions affecting the lumen of the intestine, for example inflammatory bowel disease.
- **The nutrition team** look after patients who are not able to meet their nutritional requirements and need nutritional support.
- The hepatology team look after patients mainly with conditions affecting the liver.

The doctors in these teams care for patients on both Ward 42 and Ward 43.

What to expect during your stay

You will be allocated to one of the consultant teams. This depends on your reason for admission into hospital and current symptoms. If you have been transferred onto the ward from a different department for example, surgery or a cancer (oncology) ward, you will continue to be looked after by their team of doctors. They will not be based on our wards.

You will be seen by the medical team which includes a consultant or a registrar, from Monday to Friday. This is to check your progress and plan your care for the days ahead. The medical team make ward rounds on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

After 5pm and at weekends there is an on-call team of doctors who attend emergencies, see unwell patients, and see patients who may be ready to be discharged home. You will not always have a medical review over the weekend unless the doctors or nursing staff feel it is needed.

Ward rounds may start on either Ward 42 or Ward 43. This means you may be seen early in the morning or mid-afternoon. If you need to speak to your consultant outside the ward round, please ask the nurse looking after you to see if that can be arranged through the consultant secretaries.

Leicester's Hospitals are teaching hospitals. This means that at various times nursing and medical students may be involved in your care under supervision. They may want to sit and talk to you as part of their learning. If you have any concerns about this please speak to the nurse in charge.

The nursing team

You will have a nurse looking after you on every shift. The nurse looking after you will aim to update you on your plan of care. If you have any queries, compliments or concerns please tell the nurse. There will also be a nurse in charge on every shift who you can speak to if needed.

If you would like to speak to a senior nurse, you can also ask to talk to a Ward Sister or the Matron. You can ask for the name of the Matron from nursing staff or from the nurses station at the entrance to the ward.



Meal times

Meal times on Wards 42 and 43 in the Leicester Royal Infirmary:

- Breakfast: 8am to 9am
- Lunch: Midday to 2pm
- Tea: 5pm to 6pm

Tell us what you think

There is a box at the nurses station where you can post a message to the Matron. Please ask a member of staff to show you.

The Matron aims to open the box 3 times a week.

If the Matron is not on duty and you wish to speak to a senior member of staff, please ask for the senior nurse on-call who is on duty from 8am to 8pm, 7 days a week.
