



How to use voriconazole drops for your eye infection

You have been prescribed eye drops to treat your eye infection. Voriconazole eye drops are not a licensed product and are specially made by a production unit.

At Leicester's Hospitals we have carried out a review, which supports a 7 day shelf life for voriconazole eye drops once opened. The eye drops must be stored in the fridge.

As the drops contain no preservative, it is important that your hands are washed and clean before you touch the bottle. Care must be taken so that the dropper does not touch the surface of the eye or eye lashes.

How to use voriconazole eye drops.



If someone is putting the drops in for you, look up and away from the tip of the dropper. Put in 1 drop.

If you are doing it yourself, pull down the lower eyelid until there is a small pocket between the lid and the eye. Put in 1 drop.

Do not let the tip of the dropper touch the eye

Replace and tighten the cap immediately after use.

Store in a fridge.

Use a clean tissue to wipe any excess liquid from your cheek.
