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What does the Long Term Ventilation (LTV) Team do?

- The Long Term Ventilation (LTV) Team becomes involved with your child's care when
 it has been identified that they may need the support of a ventilator or tracheostomy
 at home.
- Our team aims to provide professional, practical and emotional support throughout your child's admission and on discharge home.
- We will discuss all of the possible options with you before making any decisions about your child's care, and will work together with you as a family to achieve the best possible outcomes for your child.
- Our service accepts families from Leicestershire, Derbyshire, Nottinghamshire, Lincolnshire, Cambridgeshire, Northamptonshire and Warwickshire and will continue to offer follow-up appointments once you are discharged from hospital.
- An LTV ward round will take place once a week. The team will review your child's
 progress and inform you of ongoing plans. You will have the opportunity to ask any
 questions.

What do the different team members do?

Respiratory Consultant:

- Helps with the management of the lung condition of your child/ infant, including advice about ventilator use and antibiotics for infection etc.
- May undertake a review of air passages by a fine flexible camera, generally in a theatre setting.
- May request and review sleep studies, as needed, for your child both in hospital or after discharge home.
- After discharge, will review your child in outpatients for continued assessment of lung disease/ growth.

ENT Surgeon:

- May assess your child's airway using a fine camera either in the ward/ clinic or theatre, depending on their individual needs.
- Will undertake an operation to insert a tracheostomy, if this is needed by your child.
- Will provide advice and support for your child, both in the hospital and home, about tracheostomy management.

LTV Specialist Nurse:

- Will oversee and co-ordinate the discharge process.
- Will facilitate training for you and other family members.
- Will link with other team members and outside agencies as needed, for a smooth and safe discharge.
- Point of contact upon discharge.

Physiotherapist:

- Creates chest clearance programmes for your child and provides equipment for this if needed.
- Trains and educates parents and carers in chest clearance techniques.
- Provides support on discharge with regular monitoring and rapid response visits (Diana Team Physiotherapists for Leicestershire patients).
- Will support you with your child's development.

Occupational Therapist:

- Is available to support your discharge home and provide relevant equipment if needed.
- Will support you with your child's development.
- Can provide advice for travelling in the car with your child, and can assess your child in their car seat as needed.
- Will provide advice and support for buggy and wheelchair provision, and can assess your child in their buggy or wheelchair as needed.
- Will liaise with community services to make sure that children are supported after their discharge from hospital.

Speech & Language Therapist (SLT):

- Is trained to work with patients with communication and swallowing difficulties.
- Is able to assess and provide recommendations around swallowing/ oral intake.



- Is able to assess and provide advice around communication (speech, voice, language, alternative communication methods).
- Will develop individualised plans for communication and eating/ drinking development.
- Will liaise with local speech and language therapy services about ongoing input.
- Trains and educates parents and carers in supporting communication development.

Clinical Psychologist:

- Is available to offer psychological support to your child, their siblings, or to parent(s)/ carers, at times when you may be struggling emotionally as a result of your child's condition and the impact this has.
- Can offer assessment of psychological difficulties (low mood, anxiety, anger) related to your child's condition, and provide support with these issues through talking therapies or signposting to more appropriate services.
- Can offer support and advice on how to understand and manage behaviour related to your child's condition, that may seem difficult to understand.
